

Opening the Sutra

The most excellent teaching of the Great Vehicle is very difficult for us to understand. We shall be able to approach enlightenment when we see, hear or touch this sutra. Expounded is the Buddha's truth. Expounding is the Buddha's essence. The letters composing this sutra are the Buddha's manifestation.

Just as perfume is caught by something put nearby, so shall we be richly benefited by this sutra, even when we are not aware of it; so many merits are accumulated in this sutra!

Anyone can expiate their sin, do good deeds, and attain Buddhahood by the merits of this sutra. It does not matter whether they are wise or not, or whether they believe the sutra or reject it.

This sutra is the most wonderful and most excellent taught by the Buddhas of the past, present and future. May we meet and receive it, birth after birth, world after world!

The Sutra of the Lotus of the Wonderful Dharma

Chapter 2 - Expedients

Thereupon the World-Honored-One¹ Quietly emerged

From his samadhi²

And said to Shariputra³

The wisdom of the Buddhas

Is profound and immeasurable

- $^{\rm 1}$ World-Honored-One is one of the ten titles given to the Buddha.
- ² Samadhi is a deep meditation or concentration.
- ³ Shariputra was known as the wisest among the Buddha's disciples.
- ⁴ A Sravaka is one who hears the teachings of the Buddha.
- ⁵ The Pratyekabuddhas, or "private Buddhas" are those who strive for enlightenment without observing teachings.
- ⁶ This is another title of the Buddha. It means roughly "thus gone one." (It is pronounced Ta-tha'-ga-ta.)
- ⁷ In ceremonies, we normally repeat the text enclosed in brackets three times.
- ⁸ Anuttara-samyak-sambhodi is the perfect enlightenment reached by the Buddha. The Lotus Sutra contrasts this with the imperfect enlightenment taught by the Buddha in earlier Sutras
- ⁹ The World-Voice-Perceiver Bhodisattva is known as Avalokitesvara in Sanskrit, Kannon in Chinese and Kanzeon in Japanese. There are various depictions of this Bodhisattva as either male or female. We choose to represent her as female.
- ¹⁰ The Dhuta is the discipline to release one from ties to clothing, food and shelter.

Become devout, upright and gentle,

And wish to see me

At the cost of their lives,

I reappear on Mount Sacred Eagle

With all my Sangha

And say to them:

"I always live here

I shall never be extinct.

I show my extinction to you expediently

Although I never pass away."

I also expound the unsurpassed Dharma

To the living beings of other worlds

If they respect me, believe me,

And wish to see me.

You have never heard this:

Therefore you thought that I pass away.

I see perverted people sinking

In an ocean of sufferings

Therefore I disappear from their eyes

And cause them to admire me.

When they adore me,

I reappear and expound the Law to them.

I can do this by my supernatural powers.

For innumerable aeons

I live on Mount Sacred Eagle

And in all other abodes.

Perverted people think:

"This world is in a great fire.

The end of the aeon is coming."

Really this world of mine is peaceful.

It is filled with gods and people.

The Difficulty of Keeping the Sutra

From Chapter 11 - Beholding the Stupa of Treasures

It is difficult to keep this sutra

I shall be glad to see anyone

Keeping it even for a moment;

So will all the other Buddhas.

They will be praised by all the Buddhas.

They will be full of valor,

And full of endeavour.

They should be considered

To have already observed the precepts,

And practiced the dhuta¹⁰.

They will quickly attain

The unsurpassed Buddha-way.

Anyone who reads and recites this sutra

Will be a child of mine.

They will be considered to live

On the stage of purity and good.

Anyone after my extinction

Who understands the meaning of this sutra

Will be the eye of the world

Of gods and people.

Anyone who expounds this sutra

Even for a moment in the dreadful world

Should be honored with offerings

By all gods and people.

Tranquil Light shall be made manifest in our sight; our Buddha nature shall be identified with the Buddha of Three Bodies in One; and together with all other beings, we shall enjoy living in the Land of Truth.

May the sound of our chanting the Sacred Title permeate the whole world, be offered to the Three Treasures, and bestowed on all beings! May all beings enter the world of the One Reality, the Great Vehicle; may the Buddha-land be adorned and all beings favored with the merits of our chanting!

Odaimoku Chanting

I obtained this by ages of practices.

All of you, wise people!

Have no doubts about this!

Remove your doubts, have no more!

The Buddha's words are true, not false.

The physician who sent a messenger expediently

To tell his perverted children

Of his death in order to cure them Was not accused of falsehood though living. Likewise I am the father of this world. I save all living beings from suffering. Because they are perverted, I say That I pass away even though I do not. If they always see me, They will become arrogant and licentious And cling to the five desires Till they fall into evil paths. I know all living beings, Who practice the way and who do not. Therefore I expound various teachings According to the capabilities of all. I am always thinking: "How can I cause all living beings To enter into the unsurpassed way And quickly become Buddhas themselves?"

The Merits of the Lotus Sutra

From Chapter 21—The Supernatural Powers of the Tathagatas⁶

Thereupon the Buddha
Said to the great Bodhisattvas
Headed by Superior-Practice
The supernatural powers of the Buddhas
Are as immeasurable, limitless and inconceivable
As I have already told you.
But I shall not be able to tell
All the merits of this sutra
To those to whom this sutra is to be transmitted
Even if I continue telling them

From the Itai-Doshin-Ji

All things are possible if people are united in one mind. Nothing can be accomplished if they are not united. If a person has two thoughts, nothing can be accomplished. Even if there are hundreds or thousands of people, if they are united in one, they are surely able to accomplish their aim.

From the letter to Myomitsu Shonin

I, Nichiren, sincerely keep the most profound Lotus Sutra among other sutras which have been preached, are being preached, and will be preached. I also chant the Sacred Title, the heart of the Sutra, by myself and teach others to chant it. Mugwort grass grows straight amidst the hemp field. Trees do not grow straight, but by cutting them straight, they become useful. If you chant the Sutra as it instructs, your mind will be straightened. Be aware that it is hard for us to chant the Sacred Title unless the spirit of the Eternal Buddha enters into our bodies.

Devotion

The Wonderful Truth expounded in the Sutra whose Sacred Title we now chant is what the past Buddhas taught, the present Buddhas are teaching, and the future Buddhas shall teach. It is the Great Law, true and pure, the propagation of which was entrusted primarily to Superior-Practice Bodhisattva by the Buddha on the Vulture Peak. Once we chant the sacred title, *Namu Myoho Renge Kyo*, we shall attain the right view that the three thousand things exist in our minds just as they are; the Pure Land of

From the Hokke-Shuyo-Sho

Since time immemorial all people on the earth have been the Buddha Shakyamuni's beloved children. We had not realized the relationship, because we had been undutiful children. It is a unique relationship. As the moon reflects on calm water, the Buddha appears in our mind.

From the Letter to Myoichi Ama

Those who put their faith in the Lotus Sutra are like winter, for many hardships come incessantly. Winter is surely followed by spring. We have never heard or seen that winter returns to fall. We have never heard that those whose faith is in the Lotus Sutra return to become ordinary people. The Lotus Sutra says, "All people who listen to this sutra will attain Buddhahood."

From the Kaimoku-Sho

To be filial(*ko*) means to be high(*ko*); heaven is high but not any higher than being filial. To be filial(*ko*) also means to be deep(*ko*); the earth is deep but not any deeper than being filial. Both sages and the wise come from filial families. How much more should students of Buddhism realize the favors they receive and show gratitude for them? Disciples of the Buddha should not fail to feel grateful for the four favors received from parents, people, nation, and Buddhism. Show gratitude to them.

By my supernatural powers

For many hundreds of thousands of billions of asamkhyas of kalpas.

To sum up, all the teachings of the Tathagata, All the unhindered, supernatural powers of the Tathagata,

All the treasury of the hidden core of the Tathagata, And all the profound achievements of the Tathagata Are revealed and expounded explicitly in this sutra. Therefore, keep, read, recite, expound and copy this sutra.

And act according to the teachings of it With all your hearts after my extinction! In any world where anyone keeps, reads, recites, expounds or copies this sutra,

Or acts according to its teachings,
Or in any place where a copy of this sutra is put,
Be it in a garden, in a forest, under a tree,
In a monastery, in the house of a lay believer,
In a hall, in a mountain, in a valley, or in the
wilderness.

There should a stupa be erected And offerings be made to it Because, know this, The place where the stupa is erected Is the place of enlightenment. Here the Buddhas attained Anuttara-samyaksambodhi. ⁸

Here the Buddhas turned the wheel of the Dharma. Here the Buddhas entered into Parinirvana.

The Sutra of the Lotus of the Wonderful Dharma

Chapter 25 – The Universal Gate of World-Voice-Perceiver Bodhisattva⁹

World-Honored One with the wonderful marks! I ask you about this again.
Why is this child of the Buddha
Called World-Voice-Perceiver?

The Honorable One with the wonderful marks
Answered Endless-Intent in gathas:
Listen! World-Voice-Perceiver practiced
According to the conditions of the places of salvation
Her vow to save beings is as deep as the sea
You cannot fathom it even for kalpas.

On many hundreds of thousands of millions of Buddhas

She attended and made a great and pure vow.

I will tell you about her vow in brief.

If you hear her name, and see her, and think of her constantly,

You will be able to eliminate all sufferings.

Suppose you are thrown into a large pit of fire By someone who has an intention of killing you. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, The pit of fire will change into a pond of water.

Suppose you are in a ship drifting on a great ocean Where dragons fish and devils are rampant.

From the Kanzin-Honzon-sho

When the sun shines brightly in the sky, everything is visible on the earth. In the same manner, those who understand the *Sutra of the Lotus Flower of the Wonderful Dharma* will be able to know why calamities take place. The compassion of the Buddha is great. To save those who live in the Age of Degeneration, and who are too ignorant to know the truth of the Three-thousand-existences-in-one-mind, the Buddha wraps this gem in a bag of the five characters: *Myo Ho Ren Ge Kyo*, and hangs the bag around their necks. Those who are given this bag will be protected by the four great Bodhisattvas.

From the Shoho-Jisso-Sho

Have faith in the Great Mandala Gohonzon, the most superlative in the world. Endeavor! Endeavor to strengthen your faith, so that you may be blessed with the protective powers of all Buddhas. Learn and practice to strengthen your faith. Without learning and practicing there is no Buddhism. To learn and to practice are a part of faith. Follow these yourself and influence others to do the same. Even if only a word or phrase, spread it to others.

From the Sado-Gokanki-Sho

I, Nichiren, vowed to learn and to master Buddhism and to attain Buddhahood so that I would be able to save the people from whom I had received favors. To attain Buddhahood, one must not think selfishly, even at the cost of his life. Do not doubt her at a moment's thought! The Pure Saint World-Voice-Perceiver is reliable When you suffer and when you are confronted With the calamity of death

By all these merits, she sees All living beings with her compassionate eyes. The ocean of her accumulated merits is boundless. Therefore, bow before her!

Nichiren's Instructions

From the Ho-on-sho

If my compassion is great, the chanting of *Namu Myoho Renge Kyo* will be transmitted for all posterity, generation after generation, even to the age after the expiration of the ten-thousand year age of Degeneration. This chanting has the merit of liberating all people from blindness. It blocks the way to hell. To perform the Bodhisattva practices in the Western Paradise for one hundred years is much easier than to do the same in the defiled world just for one day. The propagations of the Lotus Sutra during the two thousand years from the beginning of the Age of the Right Teachings of the Buddha to the end of the Age of the Counterfeit of the Right Teachings of the Buddha were much easier than the propagation of the Sacred Title during the Age of Degeneration even for a moment. I am not wiser than the others. It is only the needs of the time that have established this merit.

If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, The ship will not be sunk by the waves.

Suppose you are pushed Off the top of Mount Sumeru by someone. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, You will be able to stay in the air like the sun.

Suppose you are chased by someone evil, And pushed off a mountain made of diamond. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, You will not lose even a hair.

Suppose bandits are surrounding you, And attempting to kill you with sharp swords. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, The bandits will become compassionate towards you.

Suppose you are sentenced to death, And the sword is drawn to behead you. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, The sword will suddenly break asunder.

Suppose you are bound up In pillories, chains, manacles or fetters. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, You will be released from them.

Suppose someone curses you to death, Or attempts to kill you through various poisons. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, Death will be brought to that person instead. Suppose you meet raksasas Or poisonous dragons or other devils. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, They will not kill you.

Suppose you are surrounded by wild animals Which have sharp, fearful tusks and claws. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, They will flee away to distant places.

Suppose you meet lizards, snakes, vipers or scorpions
Emitting poisonous vapor like flames.
If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver,
They will go away as you call her name.

Suppose clouds arise, lightning flashes, thunder peals,
Hail falls and a heavy rain comes down.
If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver,
The thunderstorm will stop at once.

World-Voice-Perceiver will save All living beings from misfortunes And from innumerable sufferings of the world By the wonderful power of her wisdom.

She has these supernatural powers.
She employs various expedients with her wisdom
In the ten quarters, there is no ksetra
In which she does not appear at all.

Hell, the region of hungry spirits, and the region of animals,

That is, the three evil regions will be eliminated. The sufferings of birth, old age, disease and death Will gradually be eliminated.

She sees the truth of all things and their purity. She sees all things with her great wisdom. She sees all things with loving kindness and compassion.

Think of her constantly! Look up at her constantly!

Her precepts out of her loving-kindness brace us up as thunderbolts.

Her wishes out of her compassion are as wonderful as large clouds.

She pours the rain of the Dharma as sweet as nectar, And extinguishes the fire of illusions.

Suppose you are in a law court for a suit, Or are on a battlefield, and are seized with fear. If you think of the power of World-Voice-Perceiver, All your enemies will flee away.

Her wonderful voice comes from perceiving the voice of the world.

It is like the voice of Brahman, like the sound of a tidal wave.

It excels all the other voices of the world. Therefore, think of her constantly!
